



QUESTIONS & ANSWERS May 21-28, 2009

Question: Are we planning a trip to Scotland?

Yes! Rev. Richard Gibbons has graciously accepted our invitation to lead a group on this exciting journey to his native homeland.

Question: How do we sign-up?

There will be a **1-Day** Registration at FPC on Friday, **May 30, 2008** from 9:00am-10:30am in the Loggia. **Where is the Loggia?** The large glass area near *The Vineyard* and adjacent to the Harper Chapel courtyard.

Question: The cost for this once-in-a-lifetime trip?

\$2,900 per person FPC member \$3,200 pp non-member *Single Room rate is the same as non-member.*
\$1000 **Deposit** per person due at 1-Day Registration. **DEPOSIT IS REFUNDABLE WITH TRAVEL INSURANCE.**
Tips not included or airline fuel surcharges. Current U.S. Passport required. If your Passport will expire anytime in 2009, you need to renew it. You must bring your Passport on May 30th. We will need to photocopy it to purchase the airline tickets. You will receive information on how to purchase Travel Insurance on May 30th. We highly recommend Travel Insurance. Please make Deposit check payable to: First Presbyterian Church.

Question: Is the Scotland trip only for members of First Presbyterian Greenville?

Each hotel room *must be occupied by a member* of First Pres Greenville. First Pres Greenville members traveling alone, may invite one guest to travel with them and share a hotel room. No more than two people per room.

Question: Which hotels are we using?

European chain hotels. Richard Gibbons is familiar with the hotels and they come with his recommendation. Two-nights *Edinburgh*, three-nights *Aviemore*, last night *Inchyra*. Breakfast and Dinner included at the hotel.

Question: What sites do you expect to visit?

Edinburgh Castle, Holyrood Palace, Edinburgh Royal Mile including John Knox House, Greyfriars Kirkyard, the Parliament Building, shops on Princess Street; morning worship in St. Andrews, Urquhart Castle, Martyr's Monument, brief visit to 18th green Royal & Ancient Golf Club - St. Andrews Old Course; Aviemore, Inverness, Culloden Battlefield, Clava Cairns, Ceilidh Church Hall (Scottish Circle Dancing), visit Isle of Skye, Eilean Donnan Castle, Fish & Chips, journey down the scenic West Coast route: Ben Nevis, Fort William, Glencoe Pass, Rannoch Moor, Loch Lomond, Glasgow.
