Fort Hill was the homestead of South Carolina's eminent statesman John C. Calhoun during the last 25 years of his life. It is designated a National Historic Landmark by the United States Department of the Interior and listed on the *National Register of Historic Places*. The 1,100-acre plantation was acquired by Calhoun circa 1825.

In 1888, Thomas Green Clemson, the son-in-law of Calhoun, bequeathed the Fort Hill plantation and cash to the state of South Carolina for the establishment of a scientific and agricultural college. He specified that Fort Hill "*shall always be open for the inspection of visitors.*" After the tour, we'll dine at one of Clemson's oldest and finest establishments... Pixie & Bill's.
