Rising to the Challenge Congregational Life During 2020-2021

s we enter the fall season and a busy period of activities for First Pres, we also look back and give thanks to God for His faithfulness to us amidst an unprecedented 18 months.

The COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in significant loss of life, adverse impacts on the economy, a national state of emergency, the disruption of our children's education, uncertainty for small businesses, mounting pressure on our healthcare system, and an untold sense of grief for families who lost loved ones or were unable to visit the most vulnerable. It was a difficult year. Yet despite the overwhelming challenges for our congregation, not only have we survived, but at times we have thrived.

Your persistent prayers, remarkable support, and patient encouragement have enabled our staff, Session, and Diaconate to face a multiplicity of challenges. When we canceled Sunday morning in-person worship in March 2020, our Session demonstrated thoughtful and prayerful leadership, which was insightful and deeply appreciated as we wrestled with major decisions that impacted all aspects of our congregational life. Last spring and in the months since then, our deacons and staff have displayed consistent care and concern for the most vulnerable among us.

In reopening the church for in-person worship in May of 2020, our staff consulted with other local congregations and medical professionals before putting in place a number of mechanisms to help safeguard the congregation in the midst of the pandemic. We were deeply grateful to you for your cooperation during that period and since.

Despite the challenges, one of the surprising outcomes of COVID was the high number of individuals joining us locally, nationally, and internationally through our Sunday morning livestreamed services. During the height of the pandemic, online statistics revealed that people were joining us on Facebook from not only our neighboring states of North Carolina and Georgia, but also from the United Kingdom, Brazil, Pakistan, the Dominican Republic, Germany, India, Canada, Nigeria, Zambia, and Switzerland. On our YouTube channel, viewers joined us from South Africa, Thailand, Russia, Brazil, Indonesia, and South Korea for a total watch time of **12,824**

Video Lessons

When the pandemic hit, we did not know how long the church would be shut down. Realizing parents needed support and children needed consistency, our team and volunteers created weekly Sunday morning and Wednesday video lessons and emailed them to our families. Even after many people began attending in person, we have continued to send out a Sunday morning video teaching for those who are not yet able or comfortable returning. We made 54 videos to stav connected to the children and help them grow in their faith. While some videos are straight Bible teaching, others are simply silly. Check them out on FPC's Vimeo channel!

Virtual VBS 2020

In June of 2020, we held our first virtual Vacation Bible School. As families drove through the parking lot, Children's Ministry team and volunteers handed out VBS activity supplies, sprayed water, and aimed bubble machines at the children in their cars.

Parking Lot Popsicle Party

While the church was still closed down during the pandemic, everyone enjoyed a drivethrough Popsicle Party. This simple activity allowed us to say hello to the children and their parents as they passed through the parking lot and picked out their favorite frozen treats.









Pen Pals for the Homebound

During the quarantine, over **100** cards were sent by children and adults to encourage FPC homebound members. Recipients responded with thank you cards, which then sparked a Pen Pal ministry that continues today.

Family on Mission 2020

Since Day Missions could not occur in 2020, we offered Family on Mission opportunities for the month of July. Families worked together to serve an FPC homebound member or person from our community. This was so popular that it extended into August. Many people received help with yardwork, repairs, errands, transportation to doctor appointments, and more. Three of our members rebuilt an old piece of playground equipment for a local ministry. An added bonus was that those providing the services had a chance to bond with those they were serving.

Promotion Sunday

Since we could not gather to celebrate Promotion Sunday in August of 2020, each First Pres child received a package in the mail. The gift boxes contained a congratulations card, candy, and confetti!

Care Packages

After a week of purchasing supplies and assembling bags, over **100** care packages were delivered to FPC homebound members. While they loved receiving the gifts, they especially appreciated the outdoor visit and being remembered during the isolation of the pandemic.

VBS 2021

In June of 2021, Vacation Bible School was again a traditional on-campus event, even in the midst of construction. In keeping with our Concrete & Cranes theme, over **170** children sang and learned how Jesus is our solid foundation while wearing construction worker vests and hats!

Our VBS offering of \$1,760.98 was donated to Joni and Friends' "Wheels for the World" program, which provides wheelchairs for disabled children and people around the world. The children were inspired to be extremely generous with their offering. We were hoping to raise enough money to buy 1 wheelchair; instead we were able to buy 7!

Day Missions 2021

Day Missions also returned to full swing this year with **75** students and **25** volunteers heading out into the community each day to serve, love, pray with, assist, and encourage everyone they met. Groups delivered over **330** "Hero Blessing" gifts to First Responders and over **160** "necessity bags" to residents



in low-income housing. Students also did yardwork for the homebound and for some single parents, picked up trash in downtown Greenville, distributed bottles of cold water to passersby in local parks while offering prayers, and much more. God revealed Himself in a beautiful way through all who served, donated, and prayed.

Throughout year, the elementary children bring in dimes (and various other monies) to drop in a 2-liter bottle for the Compassion Connection ministry. This organization connects us with local ministries where our folks can serve each summer during Day Missions. We were able to give them an offering of **\$125** of mostly dimes to use as they serve Greenville year-round!

Operation Christmas Child

When the church held its annual Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child shoebox collection in November, over 200 boxes were collected and sent to impoverished areas around the globe. Through this ministry, recipients are also taught about the Greatest Gift of all: *Jesus!*

"We Love You" Signs

Just before Valentine's Day, we delivered yard signs and Valentine treats to all First Pres families with children and to those serving as Children's Ministry volunteers. Many families had not been to church in months. This event allowed us to visit with folks from "across the porch," and it was so good to see the children face-to-face.

Easter Angels

Normally, our Easter Angels event involves delivering homemade cookies and cards to the lobby of the Summit Apartments, across Washington Street from our church, and visiting with the **15** or so residents who come down to the lobby. Because of COVID restrictions, we were not allowed to visit this year. Instead, we provided wrapped treats and Easter cards for Summit staff to deliver to the door of *every* resident—over **100**!

First Pres Nursery School

Last year First Pres renamed its 30-year Mother's Morning Out program to First Pres Nursery School. When COVID hit in early 2020, FPNS closed from March through May, then opened for 4 weeks of 2020 summer camp to help meet families' needs. The 2020-2021 school year proceeded on schedule under COVID protocols, serving 65-70 families, followed by a 2021 summer camp that was packed out, serving over 150 families. God has truly blessed this ministry of loving and caring for kids and families!

Foster & Adoption Ministry Orphan Sunday

Our annual Orphan Sunday event in November of 2020 featured a Moment for Missions report in all three worship services. We highlighted ways that every believer can "do something" to help take care of the orphans in today's world, and in doing so, shine the light of Christ. Thanksgiving Grace

FPC hosted a Thanksgiving meal for families working toward reunification with their children who had previously been placed in foster care. This meal is known as "Thanksgiving Grace," and that's exactly what was extended to these families: grace and respect. Their delicious meal was served on china and presented with friendly smiles. The children enjoyed the special time visiting with their families, too. We plan to make this an annual event.

Suitcases and Duffle Bags

Another part of our Foster & Adoption Ministry is the collection of new and gently used suitcases and duffle bags for children in foster care. These donations enable children to place their belongings in a suitcase rather than in a plastic bag as they are being removed from their homes and relocated to foster homes. This simple item can give a sense of dignity and worth to a child who is going through a traumatic experience and feeling as if they have no worth.

Sadly, this is an on-going need. Since we began this ministry, FPC has donated over **30** suitcases for Upstate children.

Sweet Treats

In October of 2020, we delivered Krispy Kreme doughnuts to **18** First Pres families who were fostering children or who had recently adopted. This was a "sweet" way to touch these families' lives.

Blood Drives

Our church partnered with The Blood Connection to host **3** blood drives over the last year during the critical shortage in The Blood Connection's blood supply. Many people gave back their donor gift cards for us to use in the Foster Ministry! Talk about a double blessing!



I have been fortunate to be a part of the Children's Ministry for over 27 years, starting with the nursery when my daughter was a baby. As she grew older, I began teaching first and second grade and have been there ever since. I love the children's curiosity

and enthusiasm as they ask questions to understand the stories in the Bible. It is a privilege to talk with them about how God has a plan for their lives and just how special they are because of God's love for them.

Congregational Care in Partnership with the Diaconate

Caring for Covenant Partners and the Greenville Community

hile the world focused on COVID-19, our Congregational Care Ministry focused on sharing the hope of Jesus Christ and caring for our Covenant Partners and our community.

COVID-19 coming onto the scene did not mean that cancer went away, people didn't grieve deaths, divorce didn't affect families, people no longer served in the military, elderly didn't need visits, or people didn't have financial needs. In fact, COVID-19 made all of the critical needs even more critical. Congregational Care was there to share the hope of Jesus Christ, minister with love to those in need, and bring a little joy back into their lives.

The Cancer Caring Ministry, with 15

volunteers, continued to minister to those fighting cancer. A total of **31** people received Cancer Caring Bags.



Emergency

Assistance, through the Turner Memorial Fund, assisted **69** people with financial help for utilities, totaling **\$10,785.69**.

The Flower Ministry

delivered flowers to Covenant Partners who lost a loved one over the year. Our **29** Deacons delivered **126** poinsettias and lilies: **63** at Easter and **63** more at Christmas.

Grace Bereavement

served meals to families who had a funeral at First Presbyterian. Our **40** volunteers served **19** meals to bereaved families.

Hospital Ministry

Our **29** Deacons served in the **Hospital Ministry**, making contacts each weekend to our Covenant Partners who were in the hospital. Over the course of the year they made **306** phone calls to get updates and pray with those who were hospitalized.

The Military Ministry,

with 6 team members, ministered to our Active Military Members by mailing prayer cards, quarterly letters, and military packages, which included a Military Bible and dog tags with Scripture. We currently



have **50** members in our Active Military. When we hosted our annual Veteran's Day luncheon in November, **70** attended.

Pastoral Visitation Ministry

We have **49** PVMs in our **Pastoral Visitation Ministry.** This past year the PVMs teamed up with the FPC Deacons and the Congregational Care staff to deliver **114** goody bags to our homebound for Christmas and then again for a summer surprise!

Healing Prayer Ministry

Our **Healing Prayer Ministry** team of **20** hosted the Tuesday Night Healing and Prayer Services. Over **800** attended over the course of the past year, even with more than half of the services canceled due to COVID-19. The Healing Prayer Team also hosted the Service of Remembrance in December 2020 for those who had lost a loved one over the last two years; **125** attended. They sponsored the National Day of Prayer in May of 2021, with **200** attending in person and **700** livestreaming. The Healing Prayer Team held **32** private prayer appointments throughout the year.

Prayer Card Ministry

The **Prayer Card Ministry** had **48** Prayer Warriors who prayed for each Covenant Partner for a week, progressing through the church directory alphabetically. **3,456** Prayer Cards were mailed this past year.

Prayer Room Ministry

The **Prayer Room Ministry** had **16** Prayer Warriors who prayed for all the requests that came in to First Pres via prayer cards, emails, and the website. This past year they prayed for **1,367** prayer requests, as well as for our FPC staff, missions, and ministries.

Prayer Shawl Ministry

Our **Prayer Shawl Ministry,** made up of **27** volunteers, knitted and crocheted **126** beautiful prayer shawls that were given to homebound, cancer patients, and other hospital patients. They made **150** brightly colored prayer cloths for those attending the prayer services. They also made **100** washcloths and gifted them to a women's shelter.

Touchpoint Ministry

The FPC Deacons developed a new ministry this year called **Touchpoint Ministry.** Each quarter, Deacons made phone calls to those 75 years and older to form relationships, stay upto-date with needs, and share

information about events at First Presbyterian. They made **235** calls each quarter and formed many new relationships.

Support Groups Ministry

Our **Divorce Care Support Group** facilitated a group of **6** and our **Grief Share Support Group** facilitated **2** groups of **6**. These support groups offer support and encouragement to those grieving the death of a loved one and to those going through separation or divorce.

Light & Life Ministry

Our **Light & Life Ministry** sponsored **13** showings of the one-act-play, *Viable*, across the United States, with over **970** people attending. They also sponsored the Benjamin Watson film, *Divided Hearts*, here at First Pres and invited multiple pro-life groups to share their materials with the **80** attendees.

Music Ministry

he primary goal of the Music Ministry is to glorify God and to enjoy His presence. We want to serve Christ and His body, the church, by presenting and making available music for His praise in the most excellent way possible. We want to give musicians a place to offer their musical gifts and a place for congregants to encounter the living God. Through music, we want you to encounter God (UP), through experiences to serve and get to know the body of Christ here at FPC (IN), and through taking Christ into our community (OUT).

UP—Encountering God

Throughout the past year, as the pandemic has presented many challenges for worshipers to meet and to raise up voices and play instruments for God's glory, we have maintained high-quality worship. Our Music Ministry membership has grown by at least **10%** as livestream worshipers have joined us in person to sing in the choir. In fact, we have **2** choir members who drive from other





states to join us in the choir loft as often as possible. We glorify the living God and His Son by providing worship music in Christ-centered traditional and modern worship settings. Encountering the living God—the UP—serves as our source of energy to want to share Christ with other church members and the world. Over **1150** verses in the Bible reference a word related to music. Through all styles of music presented in the most excellent way possible for God's glory, you can have an encounter with the living God, glorifying Him through music that is your "heart language," the music of your worship culture.

IN—**Our church family**

Music groups, both vocal and instrumental, provide you a way to "plug into" the church family. Modern worship has vocal groups and praise bands, and traditional worship has choir and orchestra for church members in every age group—from four years old to senior adults. Our regular rehearsals began in mid-September. Please check the website, as well as information around the church, for specific groups and rehearsal times. Missional Discipleship Ministry

Summer Student-led Missional Ministry

For the last several years, our Senior High students have traveled to the bateyes and barrios around the city of La Romana in the Dominican Republic to engage in crosscultural missions work with our various partners there, including the Good Samaritan Hospital and Eastern Dominican Christian Ministries. This year, because of COVID, our students had to find a domestic ministry partner that might offer them a similar opportunity for significant impact and learning. But where could they go and what would they do?

On July 24, after a few phone calls and training sessions, **14** of our students who had just graduated from high school a few weeks earlier, set off with our Student Ministries staff to Richmond, VA, to partner with the Christian Arabic Church (CAC)—a sister ECO congregation made up of Arabic-speaking followers of Jesus led by Rev. Fakhri Yacoub, a pastor originally ordained in the Presbyterian Church of Egypt. Over the last few years, CAC has helped over **500** immigrant families with practical needs like food, clothing, and job placement. Our students went there to help lead a week-long sports, music, and visual arts camp for immigrant children from the Middle East. What they found was a vibrant group of energetic believers who are singularly dedicated to reaching those who need their help the most.

Meagan Holmes, one of our recent high school graduates, was astounded to experience the worship of Jesus in such a different language: "Other than words like 'amen,' and 'hallelujah," she said, "Arabic is a difficult language to understand. It was incredible to know that these Christians were praising the same God that I know. I learned firsthand that God is above all languages and cultures."

Maria Jones noted, "Most of the kids at CAC had been in the States for several years, so their English was very good, but even the children who did not know English well still wanted to connect with us." She added how



delicious the Middle Eastern food was, prepared by ladies of the church for lunch and dinner each day.

Many of our young leaders from FPC remarked how much the Egyptian kids liked to learn about basketball, but they *loved* to play dodge ball and soccer. Mateo Jones commented that he knew he would be walking into a unique culture, but he was surprised at how much fun he had. He made another discovery as well: "I didn't think I was very good at working with kids, but I found out I'm not too bad at it after all once I put my mind to it."

Others mentioned the Egyptian prayer room in the church where they held their nightly worship time. Instead of sitting on chairs, they reclined on the floor. Worship music is very faced-paced and expressive, with clapping and movement throughout most songs. Eliza Anderson said, "I felt like I was a part of the global Church while I was there. We were from all over the world, but we were all there to worship the same God."

It is vitally important for all of our young people to experience the dynamism and vibrancy of the Church from around the world. It is brimming with different cultures and ways to view the world that are quite diverse from our own. But God designed the gospel in such a way that it can be "contextualized" into all the cultures of the world. From the birth of the Church at Pentecost (Acts 2) until now, the Good News about Jesus has continued to be translated beautifully into all the different languages around our planet.

Surely it must please God to hear His praise in such varied and dynamic ways. Indeed, the Book of Revelation gives us this exact picture:

After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" (Revelation 7:9-10).

As our world eventually begins to move beyond the COVID pandemic, please begin to consider again how you and our young people can be a part of some of the cross-cultural mission experiences we are starting to plan for the future. We have good friends and trusted partners among Iranians in Liverpool, Egyptians in Cairo, and Dominicans in La Romana who are eager for us to hear their stories and to share fellowship with them. Come travel with us and experience a taste of heaven now!

Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything." As we have recently studied this passage, God has shed light on how much He has grown Roots through the midst of trials over the last 12 months. There have been many highlights, but two particular ones came about as a result of COVID that we'd love to share with you.

In May, we hosted our first ever in-house retreat called Summit. We rearranged Fellowship Hall and had a weekend full of teaching, worship, and fun. It had been over a year since we had a large event, so it was a welcome change back to "normal."

In July, we took a group of 14 recently graduated seniors to Richmond, VA, to partner with the Christian Arabic Church (an ECO sister church). This group helped put on a sports, music, and arts camp for 40 Christian Arabic Church youth. God worked in incredible ways, and relationships were formed that will hopefully last for years to come! Their pastor, Fakhri Yacoub, preached at First Pres at the end of August.

This summer we also had the awesome opportunity to serve alongside Greater Mount Calvary Church and North Hills Baptist Church in a literacy program for children in the surrounding area. Each morning, 9:00-11:00am, volunteers led the students through Bible studies and helped them grow their reading skills. For three special weeks, the First Pres Youth and Children's staff and interns organized favorite field day games to let the kids run wild from 11:00 to noon. We had a blast helping out and getting to know the students, most of whom go to Hollis Academy. Our prayer is that the dream of "Transforming the Heart of the City" would be fulfilled through getting outside the four walls of the church and into the community that surrounds us.

All in all, through ups and downs, God has shown His faithfulness to His people. Although things have not looked the same this year, God has used this time to take us to places we would have never gone before. We cherish your prayers as we continue to seek Him in transforming the heart of our middle and high schools!
