

It is impossible to fulfill and achieve our focus statement without first understanding to then be able to equip our church family on Biblical Worldview. This final Leadership Training Module is an Equipping Session that is different from all of the other sessions in at least two important ways:

2/ 1. Christians / Church vs. All people

All of the other sessions were for Christians and how to relate to Christians / the Church. This one is for all people (believers and unbelievers alike) and how to relate to engage unsaved people.

2. Truthful Perspective and Priority

All of the previous sessions have provided you with spiritual tools to use as a church leader. Those sessions provided colors for the paint brush. They provided materials which are needed for a building. We must have the perspective of the Artist and Designer of Everything – God. We must see ALL as He sees ALL. ✓

This session is the **Tool box or **Tool belt** in which all of those tools are kept.

We need different Tools at different times as God's Word and Spirit direct us, but all tools are to be kept and found in the tool box or tool belt. The tool box reminds us of the tools we have at our disposal and organizes them in such a way that we can quickly access the tools we need. The tool belt enables us to carry tools with us as we move and work so that the spiritual tools we have are ready for use when we need them, wherever we are.

- **This session is the Canvas upon which all the Colors (of which You are one) rest and come together as the Artist (God) paints His portrait. ✓
- **This session is the **Foundation** upon which the entire building (our world and our faith) is supported and built.
- **This session is the only true and clear lens through which ALL of life can be understood in light of God's Truth. All people without this lens can never see clearly from the fog that constantly engulfs them in this broken, sin-infested world.

11 / II. Survey Information

To begin, we need to take a look at the lay of the land in America and South Carolina. I want us to look at some survey results from Barna, Pew, Gallup and Ligonier.

A. State of the Church in America / Greenville - Church, Denomination, Disciple Decline

- 1. Since 2000, an average of 4000 churches / year have shut their doors
- 2. Every year, 2.7 million church members become inactive... that's 225,000 per month.
- 3. The United States now ranks third behind China and India in number of non-Christians.
- 4. Based on current trends, by 2025 only 15% of Americans will attend church.
- 5. Barna reports that perhaps 50% of those attending churches are not Christians.
- 6. In New Orleans 159 church plants in last 12 years, only 3 left today ✓
- 7. Denominational Affiliation Declines
 - **Down from 50% (2000) to 30% (2016) (Gallup, July 2017)
- 8. Church greatly Influenced by Culture 12
 - a. True Disciples Declining (John 6:15-21, 67-69)
 - b. False Disciples Increasing (John 6:22-66)
 - c. Has modified its message to accommodate the culture (2 Timothy 4:3) 🗸

¹⁸ For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, ¹⁹ because that which is known about God is evident within them; for God made it evident ✓ to them. ²⁰ For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes, His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made, so that they are without excuse. ²¹ For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God or give thanks, but they became futile in their speculations, and their foolish heart was darkened. ²² Professing to be wise, they became fools, ²³ and exchanged the glory of the incorruptible God ✓ for an image in the form of corruptible man and of birds and four-footed animals and crawling creatures.

²⁴ Therefore God gave them over in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, so that their bodies would be dishonored among them. ²⁵ For they exchanged the truth of God for a lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen. ✓

²⁶ For this reason God gave them over to degrading passions; for their women exchanged the natural function for that which is unnatural,²⁷ and in the same way also the men abandoned the natural function of the woman and burned in their desire toward one another, men with men committing indecent acts and receiving in their own persons the due penalty of their error. ✓

²⁸ And just as they did not see fit to acknowledge God any longer, God gave them over to a depraved mind, to do those things which are not proper, ²⁹ being filled with all unrighteousness, wickedness, greed, evil; full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, malice; they are gossips, ³⁰ slanderers, haters of God, insolent, arrogant, boastful, inventors of evil, disobedient to parents, ³¹ without understanding, untrustworthy, unloving, unmerciful; ³² and although they know the ordinance of God, ✓ that those who practice such things are worthy of death, they not only do the same, but also give hearty approval to those who practice them. ✓


